

## Boys' Hockey Update

The boys' hockey team has had a dominant first half of the season, currently sitting at the top of the WSHL Price Division with 11 wins in 12 games. As of December 8<sup>th</sup>, the MHSAA power ranking has them as the 2<sup>nd</sup> best AA team in the province, just behind Niverville, who the Wildcats recently defeated in a 2-1 overtime win. A major contributing factor to the team's success so far this season has been the incredible consistency of starting goaltender, Mason Klassen, who has a 0.944 save percentage and 3 shutouts in the 9 games he's played. Accordingly, the Wildcats have allowed only 14 goals against in their 12 games so far. Ty Olson leads the team in goals (11) and points (18), and 6 other players currently have over a point per game, including: Braeden Ivany (17 points), Ashton Baldwin (15 points), Lexon Hogg (15 points), Layne Noren (12 points), Kael Ivany (11 points), and Rhett King (10 points). The boys are determined to continue elevating their game heading into the second half of the season.

## Planaria Regeneration






